Experience in Intellectual Property/Telecommunications/Information Technology

Over the years, Gabriela has acted for a number of brand owners and devised enforcement strategies for them in Greater China and elsewhere in Asia. Gabriela handled scores of company name hijacking cases in Hong Kong, devising a successful strategy to enforce court orders against company name hijackers. This strategy is now widely adopted by other legal practitioners in Hong Kong.

Gabriela has handled a number of IT disputes stemming from large scale outsourcing agreements as well as a number of media disputes and telecoms litigation.

Gabriela has written over 300 articles on issues concerning information technology, e-commerce, telecommunications and intellectual property law for various publications, such as *"Computers and Telecommunications Law Review"*, *"Business and Technology Information Quarterly"*, *"Computerworld"*, *"China Business Review"*, *"Copyright World"*, *"Computer Law and Security Report"*, *"International Financial Law Review"*, *"eLaw Asia"*, *"European Intellectual Property Review"* and *"IP Asia"*. Is the Asia Regional Editor for *"Computer and Telecommunications Law Review"*; and also sits on the editorial board of *"Computer Law and Security Report"* for which she contributes the regular Pacific Rim news column.
